Sessions will be chosen on the basis of its interest to PAA and its constituency as well as its relevance to the wider CAA constituency.

One proposal will be chosen for PAA sponsorship and the selected chair will receive a letter of support that he or she must submit electronically for consideration to the CAA Annual Conference Committee by its September 1st deadline.
